

Introduction

To help support grant administration and reporting activity, people who use GMAS, including those with administrative or viewer roles on GMAS administrative teams are given access to the Harvard Analytics and Reporting Tool (HART).

In HART, the Research Administration and Compliance Reporting (RACR) dashboards support various financial, administrative and compliance reporting needs.

What is HART?

HART is a tool for university reports and dashboards, supporting insights into financial, human resource, research administration and other data.

How do I access HART?

Visit the [RACR Landing Page](#) and log in with HarvardKey when prompted.

- **If your access allows you to view RACR dashboards:** Items will appear on the page with links to view.
- **If our access does not allow you to view RACR dashboards:** Links will not appear, and you should [contact your Authorized Requestor](#) for a role update.

What types of things can I do in HART?

Visit HART to run pre-configured reports on research administration data, such as:

- Detailed information about GMAS requests, subrecipients, deliverables, or approvals; and
- Financial health of projects via the collection of Grants Financial reports.

Each dashboard has functionality to [export data](#) for further processing, share a view in HART, and '[save customizations](#)' to more easily revisit dashboard views in the future.
